## Multi-disciplinary perspectives on active ageing research

## Course on doctoral level, 4.5 credits

## Welcome to a course where many perspectives of ageing research will be in focus, adjusted to participants' professional backgrounds and research areas!

It will include an overview of current ageing research issues within different professional and scientific domains. You will have the opportunity to develop an in-depth knowledge of theoretical and methodological challenges in ageing research and to be able to analyze research questions within a framework of different ageing theories with a multi-disciplinary perspective.

The work will be carried out with a blended learning approach by means of lectures, seminars, study of scientific literature, group work and discussions (internet based), but also through individual work based on each student's research project. The course will run for around eleven weeks, from week 38 until week 49, and meetings will take place at Karolinska Institutet, Campus Flemingsberg, at the following dates: September 18-19, October 17, November 7 (pre examination seminar). Deadline for final written examination admission is December 5.
